BILL NO. 1

Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Mlika that Bill No. 1 be introduced, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 220.020 ENTITLED "DEBRIS ON PROPERTY- EFFECT OF FAILURE TO REMOVE NUISANCE--PENALTIES" OF ARTICLE II ENTITLED "WEEDS, HIGH GRASS AND OTHER VEGETATION" OF CHAPTER 220 ENTITLED "NUISANCES" OF TITLE II ENTITLED "PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE AND SAFETY" OF THE TRENTON CITY CODE, which was read. The city received one bid for asphalt rock from Norris Quarries for \$17.85 per ton. We bid out for 10,000 tons. Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Romesburg to accept the bid from Norris Quarries for asphalt rock for \$17.85 per ton. Motion carried.

Randy Norden with MPUA was present to discuss the 3 bids that were received for the water treatment plant improvements. The lowest was from Central Bank of the Midwest for 2.41%. Motion by Councilmember Romesburg second by Councilmember Mlika to accept the low bid from Central Bank of the Midwest for 2.41% interest for water treatment plant improvements. Motion carried with Councilmember Brewer voting no.

City Administrator Urton went over the annual net metering report.
