Discussion was held concerning getting a new emergency mass notification service. Councilmember Briggs said this would be split between the city, county, health department and the water district. He said it has more options and the cost is less. Motion by Councilmember Urich second by Councilmember Mlika to approve the emergency mass notification services from Asher Group contingent on all other entities joining this. Motion carried.

City Administrator Urton said we received bids for sand hauling and the low bid was TB Dozing & Excavation for \$6.50 per ton. Motion by Councilmember Briggs second by Councilmember Mlika to go with the low bid from TB Zoning & Excavation for \$6.50 per ton for hauling sand. Motion carried.

City Administrator Urton said we received bids for rock hauling and the low bid was S & B Hinnen for \$2.54 per ton. Motion by Councilmember Briggs second by Councilmember Mlika to accept the low bid from S & B Hinnen for \$2.54 per ton for hauling rock. Motion carried.

City Administrator Urton went over the net metering report. Motion by Councilmember Briggs second by Councilmember Brown to accept the net metering report. Motion carried.

Motion by Councilmember Urich second by Councilmember Mlika meeting adjourned at 7:52 p.m. Motion carried.
