# **REPORTS**

Councilmember Humphreys reported on the Convention and Visitors Board meeting and the utility committee meeting, both held February 18.

City Administrator Urton gave his report.

Mayor Soptic reported that Councilmember Timothy Meinecke has resigned his position as third ward councilman and wishes to remove his name as a candidate for the same position in the April municipal election. She will be recommending an appointment to the position in the near future. Mayor Soptic mentioned that the Chamber of Commerce will no longer be in charge of the Fourth of July fireworks display. She also said that BTC Bank has set up a community 501(c)(3) and will manage it as well. She said the FEMA Bric program has been suspended and it is not known if we will be able to get the assistance we were expecting from them.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT

DeAn Witt mentioned that the intersection at 9<sup>th</sup> and Main is becoming more hazardous as motorists are attempting to use a left turn lane that does not exist. She wondered if it could be repainted more noticeably to make motorists more aware that there is no longer a left turn lane there.
